

SHA AWARDS

Honorary life Membership Certificate

Eligibility	Any resident of Saskatchewan who has rendered valuable service to the cause of horticulture.
Requirements	To have demonstrated leadership ability in horticulture at the local, district, or provincial level; to have been involved in furthering horticultural information in Saskatchewan; to have demonstrated leadership in local, district, and provincial organizations.
Nominations	Will be received by the Secretary or Awards Chairman of SHA at least two months prior to the Annual Meeting.
Award	A suitably worded life membership certificate, appropriately framed, signed by the President and Secretary of the Saskatchewan Horticultural Association, and presented to the recipient at the time of the Annual Meeting and Convention or the Provincial Show.

Certificate of Merit

Eligibility	Any resident of Saskatchewan, 21 years of age or over, who has achieved distinction in his community or province by outstanding success in horticulture, including production, selection, plant breeding, innovation encouragement, influence or contribution to the good of horticulture in any way. Professional horticulturists or full-time paid gardeners are not eligible.
Requirements	Must have produced an outstanding garden, orchard, or nursery, over a period of several years, and must have tree, bush or vine fruits or vegetables in that garden, or must have done outstanding work in landscaping or home beautification or in the production of plants for that purpose.
Nominations	will be received by the Secretary or Awards Chairman of SHA from Horticultural Societies, Agricultural Societies, and from other organizations associated with horticulture.
Award	a suitably worded "Certificate of Merit" appropriately framed, and signed by the President and Secretary of SHA and will be presented to the recipient of the award.

David R. Robinson Award

This award established in 1973, was created to recognize the outstanding contributions to horticulture in Saskatchewan by Professor David R. Robinson of the University of Saskatchewan and for his services to the Saskatchewan Horticultural Association as Secretary-Treasurer in the years 1951-68.

Eligibility	A resident of Saskatchewan who originates through breeding or selection, a greatly improved or outstanding cultivar suited to the prairies; or achieves recognition provincially, nationally or internationally, for his or her contribution in the field of horticulture.
Nominations	will be received by the Secretary or Awards Chairman of the SHA, at least two months prior to the Annual Meeting.
Award	A cash award, amount to be determined by the SHA Board, along with a suitably worded plaque imprinted with the names of the SHA President and Secretary, and presented to the recipient at the Annual Meeting or Provincial Show.
